6. R.C. NEIGHBOUR MEDIATION

Full presentation given by Caroline Wilson on the key aspects of the service with details of the helpline number and times together with leaflets that are available explaining the service. Details of the Antisocial Behaviour helpline are noted at the end of each meeting.

7. ENVIRONMENT (Andy Summers giving updates and receiving issues)

- Christmas tree lights extra power will be made available.
- Dog fouling no enforcement action is being taken at present however the council will clean up areas telephone 0141 842 4448.
- Park Project as advised the proposals were sent to the Big Lottery however they have advised that the project does not fall under their remit but that we should consider discussing the project with Sport

Scotland. It was recommended that the Community Council meet Nigel Lack of Renfrewshire Council re funding streams and the Councillors would look into the possibility of Planning Gain.

- Mayfield Court Refuse bins continue to be regularly not picked up. R. Scarsbrook has written to the Council but has not received a response with their agreed timescales.
- Grass cutting still not being cleared from pavements.
- George Street bins not down to 1 household.
- Japanese Knotweed new guidance has been received from the Scottish Government. It was reported that it is present opposite Kilknowe Colleges, in front of Hillcrest and in the Rhombus gardens.

8. INFO/WEB

- Newsletters were now available for distribution with the next one planned for post Christmas.
- It was agreed to add the details of the Councillors surgeries on to the website.
- Statistics show that the last 3 months the website had 61½k hits (19k August last year).
- Thanks given to David McKee for all his work on the site.
- HWW walks only about 7 turning up for each.
- Gardening Competition agreed to make it an annual event with prizes to be given at the Fete. For the current competition a further £10 of vouchers had been agreed by the Chair and this decision was ratified by the Committee. Vouchers given to one of the winners were passed on to the Church.
